countable income and the Medically Needy Income Limit ("threshold"). This payment is made to the		
State and is counted towards medical bills or related obligations in order to qualify for Medi	caid.

EXPLANATION: The state general fund allocation to Montana's Department of Public Health and		
Human Services (DPHHS) programs has been cut by approximately \$100 million in the current		
biennium. These cuts have primarily been to community services, not to institutional services		
administered by DPHHS. The result forces people with disabilities to obtain critical services in more		
restrictive, expensive settings (i.e., institutional care). The majority of state general fund money is		
"matched" with Federal funds. The loss of combined state and federal funds to Montanans in need is		
\$200 million, a deficit that will take years from which to recover ⁴ .
